





*The Zorg: A Tale of Greed and Murder That Inspired the Abolition of Slavery* by Siddharth Kara



The 1781 tragedy that unfolded aboard the Zorg, a Dutch ship used to transport enslaved Africans, provided the spark for the first abolitionist movement in Great Britain. After spending months along the African coast filling its cargo hold, in March 1781, the Zorg was captured by British privateers and set sail for Jamaica with over 380 enslaved people crammed below its decks. By late November, after an exceptionally long voyage while running short of provisions, the ship's crew threw roughly 130 men and women, plus a child, into the sea. Including deaths by disease and suicide, the mortality rate for this voyage exceeded 50 percent. Kara (sociology and social policy, Univ. of Nottingham; Cobalt Red) details how the presumptive enslavers' insurance claims for the people who were murdered outraged Britons and fomented one of the world's first successful abolition campaigns, with enslavement finally being outlawed in England in 1807. Based on extensive primary research, this powerful tale about greed and cruelty highlights the nearly forgotten story that launched a key campaign against enslavement.




